### First Aid Kit Guidelines

- 1. All labs must have a first aid box. The responsibility of provided the first aid box, primarily rests with the PI of the lab.
- 2. OLSEH guidelines for first aid kits are based on OSHA's standards.
- 3. Storage:
  - a. First aid kits must be easily accessible and in locations where they can be quickly reached in emergency situations.
  - b. The height to reach the handle of the First Aid Kit in a public space should be no more than 48 inches high (from the ground).
- 4. **Signage:** The container of first-aid kit shall be legibly and indelibly marked with the following information:
  - a. Words 'First-Aid Kit', in letters not less than 20 mm in height.
  - b. List of items/contents of First-aid kit a) Name of contents, quantity and other information.
  - c. Printed instructions to immediately replace expended contents.
- 5. Recommended minimum contents are:
  - a. Bandages and Wound Care
    - i. Assorted band-aids
    - ii. Gauze pads (assorted sizes at least 4 x 4 inches)
    - iii. Gauze roll (for wrapping injuries at least 2 inches wide.)
    - iv. Medical tape (for securing bandages)
  - b. Wound Cleaning and Disinfecting
    - i. Antiseptic wipes
    - ii. Any safe disinfectant.
  - a. Blister and Burn Care
    - i. Burn cream
  - b. General Medical
    - i. Medical gloves (latex or nitrile)
    - ii. First aid manual
    - iii. Scissors
    - iv. Tweezers
    - v. Thermometer (oral or digital)
    - vi. ORS
    - vii. Mild soap
  - c. Eye Care
    - i. Eye wash solution

- ii. Eye drops (prescribed by IISc health centre)
- 6. Notwithstanding point #5, the first aid kits must be designed keeping in mind the hazard profile of the lab. Mandatory extra items for lab with specific hazards are:
  - a. Chemical Lab: Ointment with Neutralizing agents e.g., calcium carbonate.
  - b. For labs with HF: Ointment with Calcium Gluconate
  - c. Biological Lab: Antiseptic lotions/creams
- 7. Maintenance tips:
  - a. Regularly inspect the first aid kit to ensure all items are present and are within shelf life.
  - b. Restock the kit as needed.
  - c. Consider designating a person responsible for maintaining the first aid kit.
- 8. Important Instructions:
  - a. This list is not exhaustive, and you should consider the specific needs of your research laboratories.
  - b. Ensure that all personnel are trained in basic first aid and know how to use the items in the first aid kit.
  - c. In case of a serious injury (secondary, direct, indirect and chronic injury) or illness, always call IISc health centre or seek immediate medical attention.
  - d. Do not include any type of medicines in First aid kits without the prescription of IISc health centre.
